

Environment Grant Guidelines

Our Commitment

As a national environmental consultancy, we are in a privileged situation as our daily work enables us to support a sustainable environment by creating special places for people, business and wildlife. We will always strive to be the best in our field and to lead by example.

Our corporate social responsibility commitment considers people, the environment and its future and TEP is keen to support activities which further the environmental profession and raise awareness of environmental issues. TEP's Environment Grant was set up to support this commitment by offering funding to individuals and local organisations from £250 up to £1,000. Its allocation is based on:

- Alignment to TEP's values (Honest, Supportive, Passionate, Forward-Looking, Enterprising and Responsible);
- Connection to the environmental profession; and
- Potential impact of funding

We also offer The Mersey Forest Grant, which can help fund tree planting initiatives in the Mersey Forest area. This covers Merseyside and North Cheshire ([see map for area boundaries](#)). Depending on the type of project, tree whips or more mature branched trees can be funded. There is no limit on the number and type of trees per project but applicants will need permission from the landowners and demonstrate in their application form a commitment to the future management of the trees.

Applicants can apply for both The Mersey Forest Grant and the TEP Environment Grant. For example, if your school is in the Mersey Forest area and would like to develop the natural environment of its grounds, and the project includes an element of tree planting, then your application can be considered for both grants. However, we reserve the right to issue just one grant.

Projects with a very clear relevance to the environmental profession and sustainable development, which include, but are not limited to:

Where can the project take place?	
Anywhere in the world if you are:	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A UK Citizen (i.e. holder of a British passport) • Other passport holder resident or in employment in the UK for minimum of 2 years • Students enrolled on a UK environmental course of a minimum 2 year duration • A UK institution, school or charity 	
OR – the UK only if you do not meet the criteria above (Ref. UK encompasses: England, Scotland, Wales, N. Ireland, Isle of Man, Jersey, Guernsey and the British Overseas Territories.)	
What can the funding be used for?	
A grant may be given for:	A grant is NOT given for:

How do I apply?	
Complete either:	
Form A if applying as an individual or on behalf of a group of individuals Form B if applying on behalf of an organisation/charity	
Then email the completed application form with accompanying documents to csr@tep.uk.com by the designated closing date.	
Projects underway before the Grant has been awarded will not be eligible for consideration	
What are the obligations on accepting a grant?	
To submit a written report within three months of project completion which includes a final account of how the grant has been used. Failure to provide a report may mean any further applications will be declined.	
TEP requires appropriate evidence of the costs involved. Any unspent funds are returned to TEP upon completion of the project. If the project is cancelled, or left uncompleted, you may be required to return all or part of the grant awarded unless exceptional circumstances apply as agreed by the CSR Team.	
TEP will use information about activities it supports in promoting its CSR actions.
