Who are we looking for?

We are seeking a highly motivated, experienced ecologist to join the TEP Ecology team, based in our Market Harbourough, London or Warrington office, supporting our business nationally. The role is suitable for office or 'hybrid working' with time split between home and office working.

The Ecology team has a broad range of clients active across the UK working on a wide range urban regeneration, infrastructure, commercial and leisure developments. Our ecologists also lead on green infrastructure, conservation and restoration schemes and strategic level projects.

The successful candidate will contribute to, and lead on, high-profile projects. This position would appeal to someone with at least four years' relevant consultancy experience with field survey skills and knowledge of ecology & the planning system.

Role and Requirements

You will actively manage a wide range of field surveys. You will be responsible for ensuring the advice and recommendations resulting from these surveys are communicated effectively to clients through written reports and verbal communication. You will be proactive in your approach to help our clients navigate the planning and licensing processes.

Candidates with a strong botanical background, who are confident in identifying the majority of UK habitats and scoping of appropriate surveys for complex projects are welcome. As are candidates who hold a bat licence.

You will be a member of our ecology team which includes over 40 in-house ecologists supported by a network of trusted sub consultants. Our ecologists are a close-knit team, promoting knowledge sharing and supporting each other in delivery of surveys and assessments. You will be comfortable working alongside fellow ecologists, designers, planners and other environmental disciplines, working collaboratively to deliver projects.

You will be asked to help mentor and support junior staff on projects as well as providing general ecology advice to colleagues across TEP's multi-disciplinary practice. You will be well-supported by colleagues, and encouraged to innovate where appropriate to enhance delivery of our service.

The successful candidate will be based at a nominated TEP office but will be expected to travel from time to time, including staying overnight at different locations, to meet the requirements of projects.

Qualifications

- ❖ Have a degree or equivalent in a relevant ecology discipline
- ❖ We are interested to hear from applicants who are Chartered or who are eligible for Associate or Full membership of the Chartered Institute of Ecology and Environmental Management (CIEEM).

Experience

- ❖ Have proven experience scoping, designing, pricing and delivering ecologically complex schemes in a development and planning setting.
- ❖ Experience producing a range of written assessments including desk based studies, technical reports, Preliminary Ecological Assessments and Ecological Impact Assessment.
- ❖ Experience authoring HRAs and/or the ecology chapter of Environmental Statements is desirable but not essential.
- ❖ Can demonstrate experience of project management skills with excellent analytical and problem-solving skills.
- ❖ Can demonstrate experience of providing consistent, professional advice with an ability to communicate effectively with colleagues, clients, planners and consulting with regulators.
- ❖ Can demonstrate experience of leading extended Phase 1 habitat and a range of protected species surveys.
- ❖ Experience undertaking higher level botanical surveys such as NVC, hedgerow, or UK Habs is desirable but not essential.
- ❖ Holds a protected species licence, and experience of designing and delivering licenced mitigation schemes is desirable but not essential.

- ❖ Self-motivated, able to manage a busy and varied workload, supervise field staff.
- ❖ Able to work independently and work collaboratively with other professionals.
- ❖ Excellent attention to detail, honesty, uphold high standards, demonstrate good judgement and delivery of work on time and within budget.
